
Call for Papers



Spring Research Conference on Statistics in Industry and Technology Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey May 17-19, 2017 New Brunswick, NJ

The 24th IMS/ASA Spring Research Conference (SRC) on Statistics in Industry and Technology is sponsored by American Statistical Association (ASA), Institute of Mathematical Statistics (IMS), and Rutgers University. The purpose of SRC is to promote research in statistical methods that address problems in industry and technology and to stimulate interactions among statisticians, researchers in the application areas, and industrial practitioners. SRC has a history of more than two decades, and has explored many interesting and important topics in research and application frontier. Paper Submission: You are cordially invited to submit a contributed talk or poster to the conference. Topics for contributed talks and posters are expected to cover a wide range of areas including, but not limited to design and analysis of experiments, modern computing, uncertainty quantification, computer experiments, machine learning, methods on quality improvement and measurement system and applications of data science in business, industry and government policy making. Research on other potential topics that are related to the conference theme will also be considered, and authors of such work are encouraged to submit abstracts.

To present a contributed talk or poster, please email a title and abstract of your paper, including your name and affiliation, to the Contributed Program Chair, Dr. Han Xiao, at <u>hxiao@stat.rutgers.edu</u> using the subject line as in "Subject: SRC 2017—Rutgers". The deadline for abstract submission is **January 31, 2017**. If the number of submitted abstracts is so large that all of them cannot be accommodated within the planned contributed sessions, we may consider switching some contributed talks to be posters.
