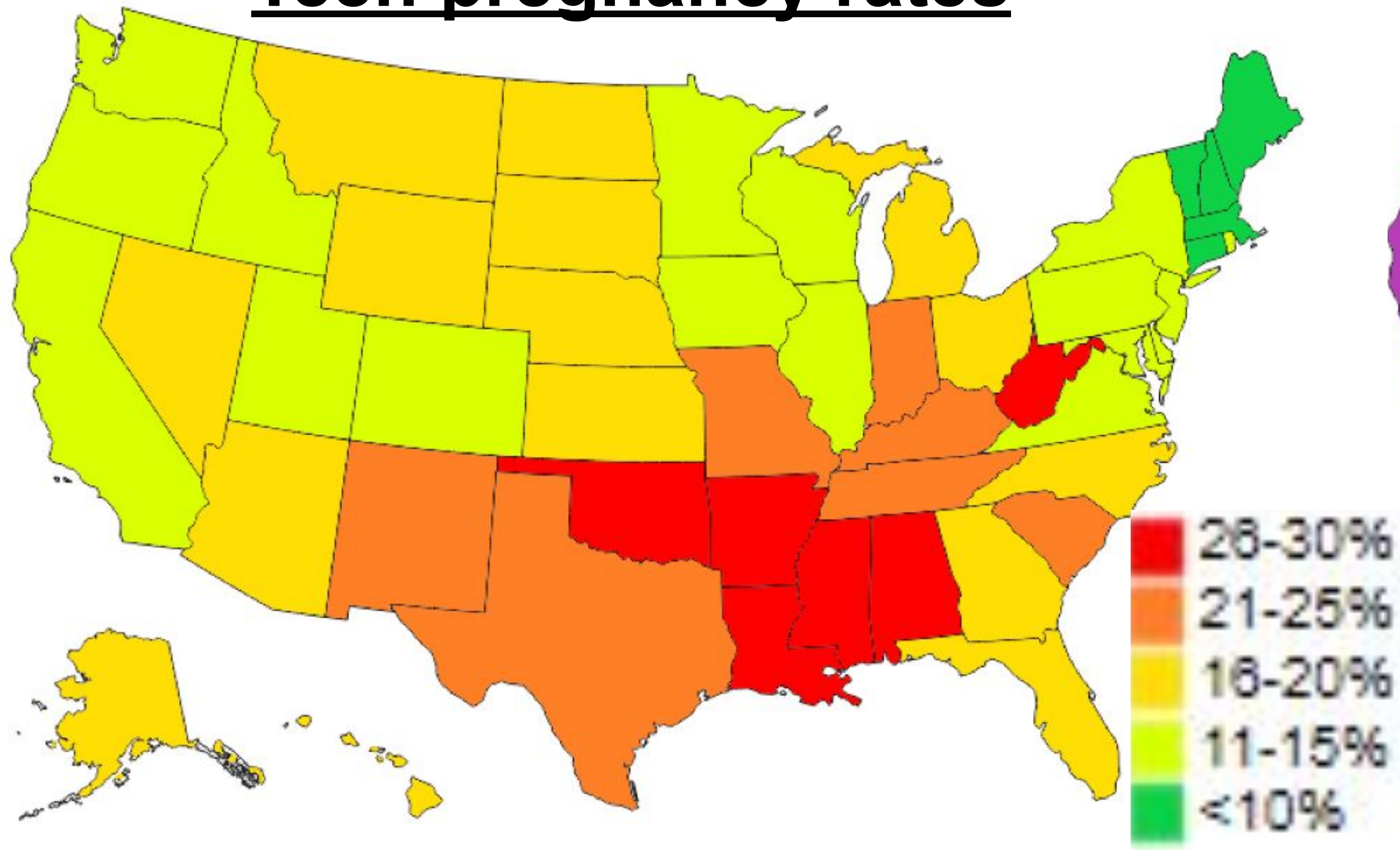
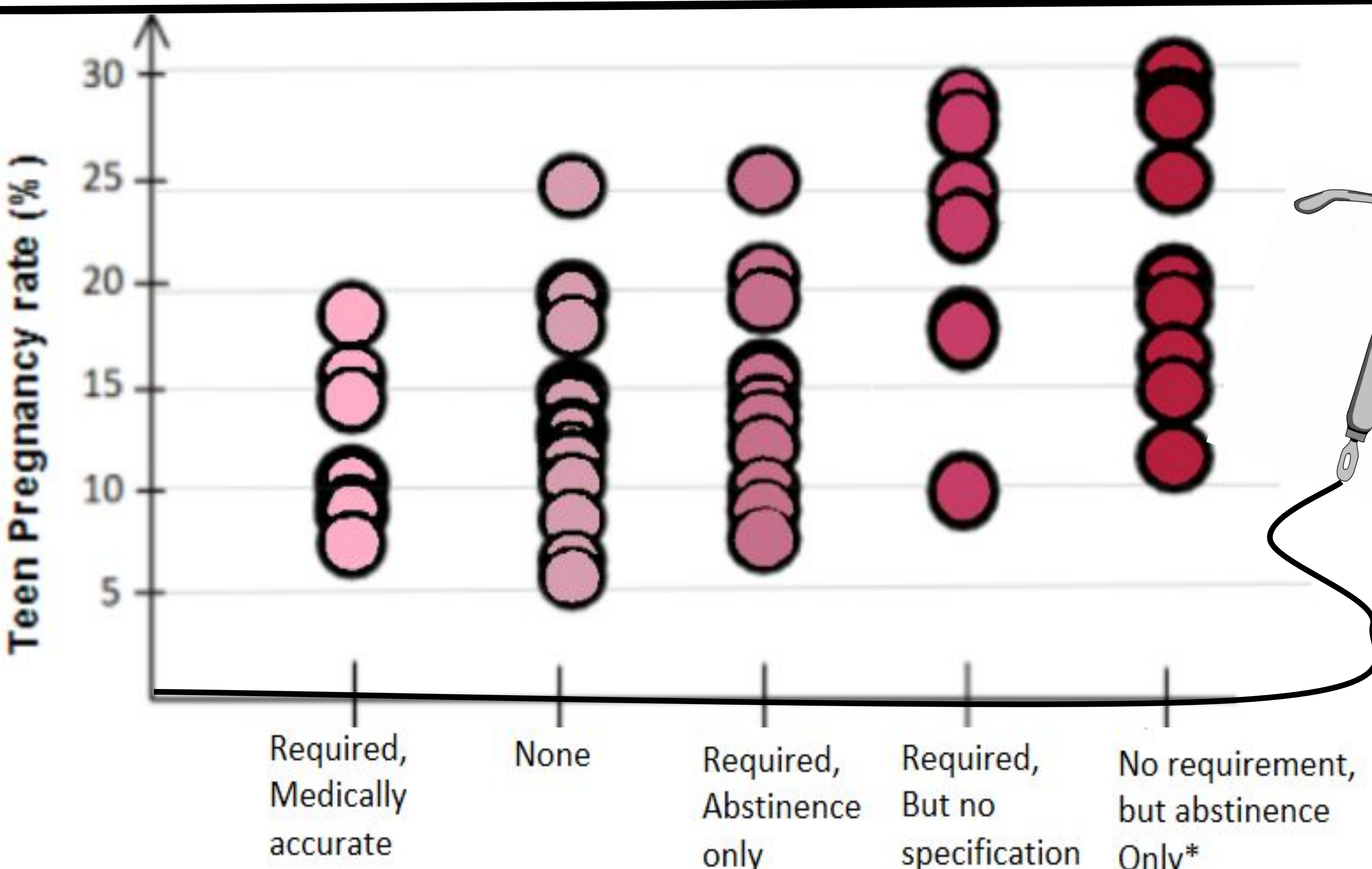
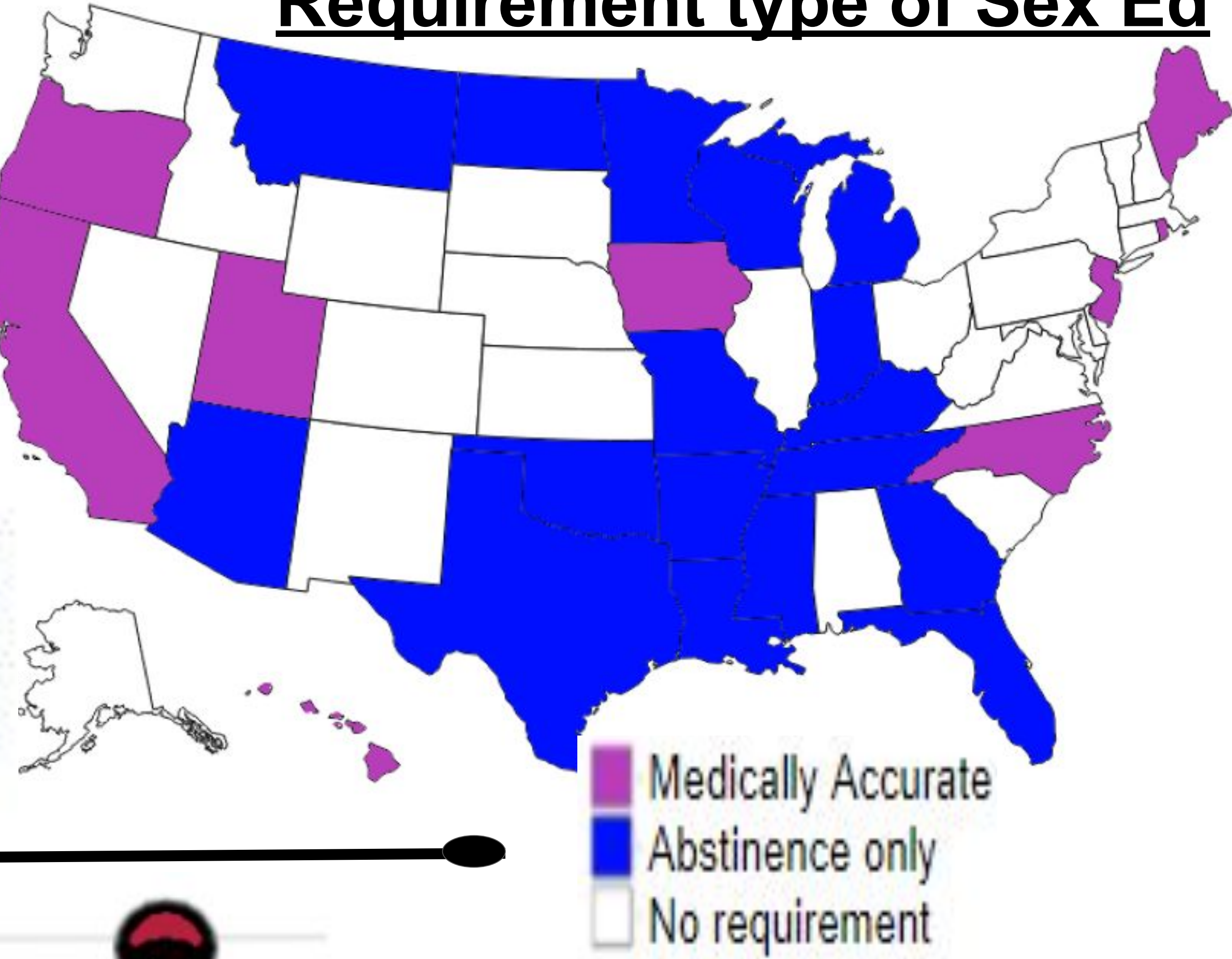


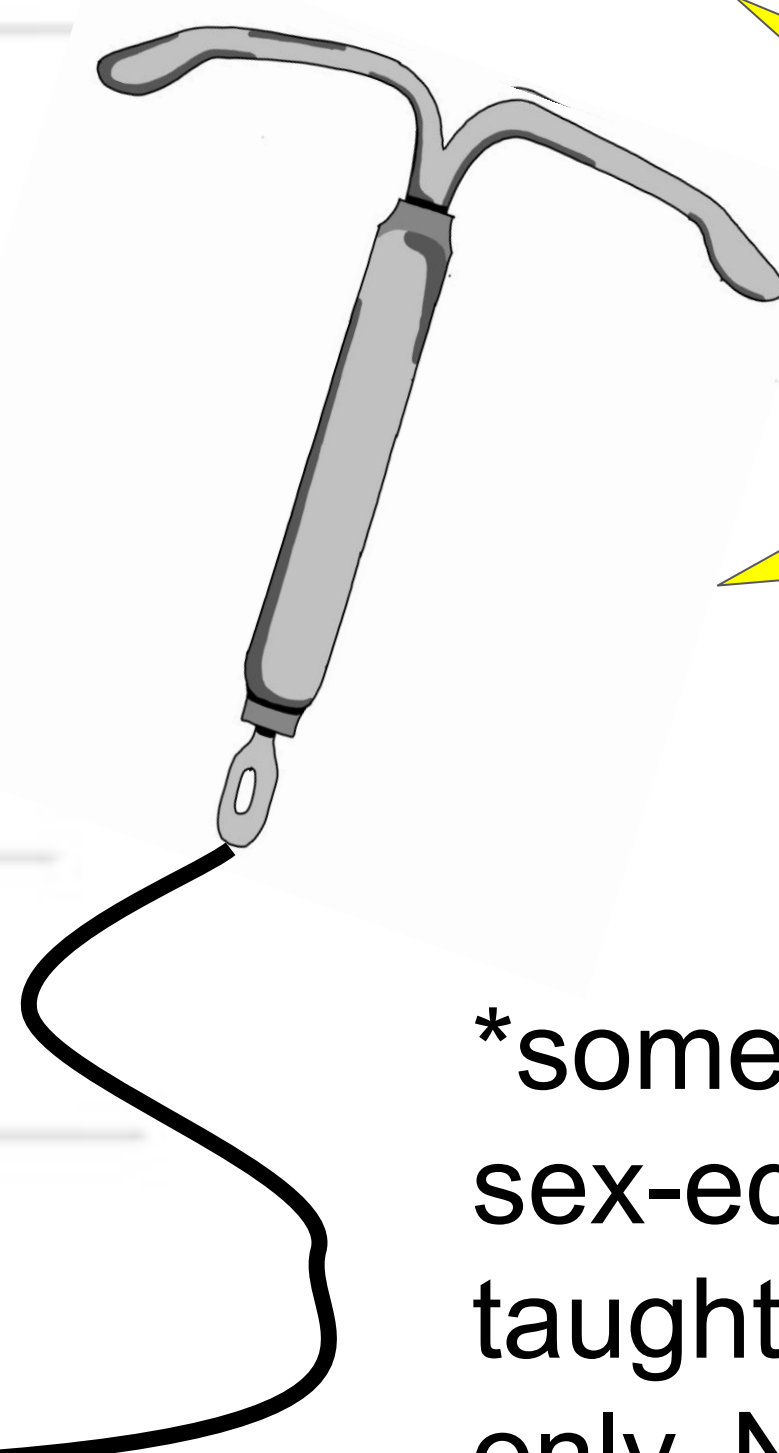
Teen pregnancy rates
